# When will the guidelines take effect?

The Hard Lockdown will begin April 23, 2021 at 12:00 PM until April 30, 2021.

# What is new with the Hard Lockdown guidelines?

1. Less business establishments will be allowed to operate inside the Critical Zone.
2. Stay-at-home policy will be strictly implemented for those living in the Critical Zone.
3. Less authorized persons may enter, exit, or travel inside the five barangays under Hard Lockdown. Some transactions and activities will also no longer be allowed throughout the Lockdown.

# Which establishments may not operate in the Critical Zone?

1. Restaurants, dining, and carinderias – *dine-in, take-out, visitors, walk-in orders, or drive-thru will no longer be allowed. Only orders made through phone calls or the Internet may be delivered to homes or offices inside the critical zone will be allowed.*
2. Accommodations – *those being used as quarantine facilities are exempted*
3. Hardware
4. Office supplies
5. Motorcycle or bicycle shops
6. Laundry
7. Printing
8. Manufacturing
9. Recruitment and placement
10. Security and/or janitorial agencies
11. Leasing firms or companies
12. Other establishments not included in the list of ALLOWED establishments

# What is different from the previous guidelines inside the Critical Zone?

# May residents of the Critical Zone go out of their respective homes?

A Critical Zone resident may only go out if they have a Quarantine Pass, but they must limit their transactions and movements inside the Critical Zone.

A Quarantine Pass must contain their name and barangay of residence, as well as their purpose for leaving their homes and the duration of their time outside their home.

# Who may enter or exit the Critical Zone?

1. City residents who have a medical emergency or are going to be vaccinated against COVID-19 at the City Coliseum
2. Vehicles coming from outside the Critical Zone who are merely passing through the Critical Zone through the National Highway. Drivers need to provide documents that prove that their transaction/s will be done OUTSIDE the Critical Zone to show at the checkpoints.
3. Individuals going to the Puerto Princesa International Airport for a flight. They must have a valid ID and airline ticket as proof.

# What are the penalties for violating the Hard Lockdown guidelines?

Aside from existing ordinances in the City, failure to comply with the guidelines may warrant a violation of Section 9, par. (d) or (3) of Republic Act No. 11332 (Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Concern Act) and its implementing rules and regulations. The violation is labeled Non-Cooperation of the Person and Entities.

# Which establishments may operate in the Critical Zone?\*

1. Hospitals, medical clinics, veterinary clinics
2. Sari-sari stores
3. Convenience or mini-grocery stores
4. Grocery stores and supermarkets
5. Fruit or vegetables stands
6. Wet and dry markets, provided that COVID marshals, barangay tanods, or any other uniformed personnel are within the premises to strictly enforce minimum public health standards
7. Water refilling stations
8. Drugstores
9. Food delivery companies (strictly to deliver to homes and offices only)
10. Public utility services – PALECO, PPCWD, and telecoms
11. Logistics, freight forwarding, cargo moving, or supply chain delivery companies
12. Mailing and courier services
13. Banks
14. Pawnshop and money transfer/remitting services
15. Gas stations
16. Construction services
17. Business Process Outsourcing, provided that employees are given dedicated point-to-point shuttle services
18. Machine repair and maintenance services
19. Funeral parlors
20. Media
21. Government offices

\*Subject to minimum workforce capacity as earlier provided

# Who may enter or exit the Critical Zone?

4. These workers are classified as APORs (a valid company ID or any proof of employment is needed)

- Doctors;
- Nurses;
- Hospital workers;
- Public utility workers (PALECO, PPCWD, telecoms)
- Cargo movers, logistics and freight forwarders, mailing and courier service workers);
- Religious ministers – priests, imams, pastors, etc.
- Lawyers
- Humanitarian workers
- Government employees

# Who may NOT enter, or exit, the CRITICAL ZONES?

1. Non-residents of San Miguel, San Pedro, San Jose, San Manuel, or Sta. Monica who work inside the five barangays even if their places of work are allowed to operate under the hard lockdown, UNLESS they are classified as APORs based on the guidelines in the LIATF resolution.
2. Residents of any of the five barangays who exit the critical zone for reasons that are not allowed under the guidelines unless the reason is a medical emergency, going to the airport for a flight, or if the resident is classified as an APOR.
3. Those exiting the critical zone to work and were previously given a quarantine pass before the Hard Lockdown are no longer allowed to do so.
